Objectives

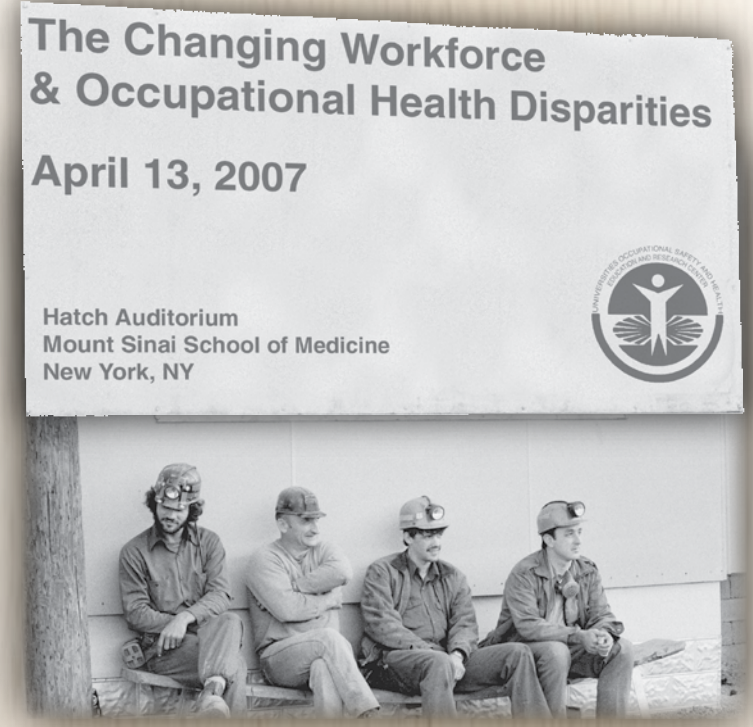
1. **Recognize** the changing demographics of the workforce, and their implications for occupational health and safety.
